We have received several inquiries this week regarding the status of our summer school program. District administration has been in close contact with state and local health officials and neighboring Kansas City metro school districts in an effort to make the best decision to serve our families, while keeping the safety and health of our students and staff as our top priority. LPS plans to release a detailed summer school plan to families later next week. While several parts of the plan are currently being finalized, there are some important details that are important for families to know, including:

- LPS is committed to providing virtual credit recovery opportunities for our high school students, and this will be included in the plan. In addition, the plan will call for all summer school learning for grades 9-12 be virtual instruction with a session in June.
- Several decisions regarding the summer school program for grades K-8 still need to be made. To help with this process, we would like to solicit your feedback in a brief survey. To access the survey, <u>click here</u>.
- If a student is not yet enrolled for summer school, and interested in participating in an option presented next week, they will have the opportunity to do so leading up to the first day of a session.
- If a student is currently enrolled for summer school, and would choose to not participate in one of the options offered next week, they would be allowed to cancel their enrollment.
- No decisions have been made regarding LPS summer camps for sports and activities. Discussions will continue in the coming days and weeks, and we will communicate with families as soon as decisions are made. Please also know that any decision made will be done so in accordance to recommendations from local, regional, state, and national health officials.

As we have shared throughout this unprecedented period, this continues to be an extremely fluid situation and one that always has the potential to change our course of action at any given time. We thank you in advance for your patience and flexibility as we strive to provide our students, staff, families, and community with a quality and effective summer school experience in a safe and healthy environment.
